## **CURRICULUM VITAE – JEFF HORSWELL (Drakesleat)**

I have been going to dog shows from an early age, as part of a wider family involvement, when a Great Dane was bought as a family pet.

A show Dane followed and the Auldmoor Great Dane kennel has gone on to produce a steady stream of Champions.

During this time I took part in Junior Handling and in 1973 was runner up in the national finals. I decided to have Miniature Wire Haired Dachshunds as my own breed. 22 Min. Wire Champions have been made up by me, including 3 Crufts B.O.B. winners and 4 Group winners.

I have always had an interest in many breeds and have also made up a Greyhound Champion and 2 Field Show Champions, along with RCCs with a Basenji and Soft Coated Wheaten Terrier.

I first judged in 1982 and first awarded CCs in 1989 to Wire and Min. Wire Dachshunds. I judged Min. Wires at Crufts in 2000, my first Hound Group in 2000 and BIS in 2003. I am approved to award CCs in breeds across 6 Groups.

## **CURRICULUM VITAE – MALCOLM ELLRICH (Malrich)**

## Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition F (Annex B)

1. These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule 42 A.
  - a. A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.
  - b. Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties or either a fine or listed under Rule 42 A.
2.
  - a. No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at the time of the show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show.
  - b. Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:
  - a. Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
  - b. The removal of dewclaws of any breed.
  - c. Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are show.

Nor must anything be done calculated in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of a dog or dogs at any show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

**DOG FOULING AND GROOMING WASTE (ANIMAL).** Any owner, exhibitor or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove immediately any fouling caused by their dog(s) and /or any grooming waste at Kennel Club licenced shows within the licenced venue and within the environs of that event, including car and caravan parks and approaches. The chalking, powdering or spraying (with the exception of water) of exhibitors within the precincts of the show is forbidden.

## BREEDERS' COMPETITION

The BREEDERS' COMPETITION offers the following awards:

**Best Breeder in Breed/AVNSC classes 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup>**

**Best Breeder in Group 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup>**

### Grand Final at Crufts 2013

The following requirements apply to entries for these awards:

1. Breeders wishing to enter the competition should first purchase a Breeders Competition Record Book from the Kennel Club or from the show secretary.
2. The Breeder enters for the award in his/her name and is responsible for arranging which exhibits form their breeder group or team.
3. The Breeder must complete the Record Book accurately with all necessary details before presenting it to the show organisers.
4. The Breeder is responsible for obtaining the necessary authority to complete from the show organisers (or designated official such as the Ring Steward) to compete for the award.
5. The Breeder's team must consist of a minimum of three and a maximum of four dogs of the same breed, all of which must be entered in a class at the show.
6. A Breeder may enter **more** than one team per show.
7. All dogs must have the same registered breeder.
8. The 'beaten dog' rule does not apply.
9. Best Breeder in Breed and Best Breeder in AVNSC Classes go through to a Best Breeder in Group award.
10. Breeders acquire points in competition over a calendar year as follows:

Best Breeder in Breed/AVNSC Classes	3 points
Second place Breeder in Breed/AVNSC Classes	2 points
Third place Breeder in Breed/AVNSC Classes	1 point
Best Breeder in Group	4 points
Second Breeder in Group	3 points
Third Breeder in Group	2 points
Fourth Breeder in Group	1 point

The Breeders who have amassed a minimum of 25 points over a calendar year will qualify for the Final/Semi-Final in the following year. It is not a requirement to withdraw from the competition upon reaching 25 points. At the end of the competition year in question, Breeders should forward their record books to the Canine Activities Department at the Kennel Club which will advise whether they have qualified for the Crufts Final.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The show will open at 8.30 a.m.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at 9.30 a.m.
4. Exhibits may be removed from the show after their judging has been completed. The show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the tenting and benching areas is forbidden as authorised by the Show Management.
6. ENTRY FEES: Members £13.50 per dog 1st entry for each dog, subsequent classes with the same dog £1.00. Non-Members £15, 00 for 1<sup>st</sup> entry for each dog, £2.00 subsequent entries with same dog. Veterans £6.00
7. PRIZE MONEY First £2.00 : Second £1.00 : Third 50p
8. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
9. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible for exhibition.
10. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the show is forbidden.
11. **BEST PUPPY IN SHOW** Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the show. Where a Best in Show is a puppy it will automatically be Best Puppy in Show respectively. Similarly if the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it will automatically be Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection for Best in Show respectively.  
Best Puppy in Show must be selected from puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy.  
Withdrawal from other competition. Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition, other than breed classes, prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Show in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy may subsequently be exhibited in competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.
12. **Best in Show** The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same show. Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex provided they are unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show must not compete in subsequent competition.  
Withdrawal from other competition. Dogs which become eligible for Best in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition other than breed classes prior to the competition for Best in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition from which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.  
Proviso: For the purpose of these regulations, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special award confined to a single breed will not be considered to be beaten dogs.
13. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
14. No modifications will be made to this schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
15. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparations of dogs for exhibition.
16. All dogs resident outside the U.K. must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
17. **Dogs in Cars on Hot Days:** Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's an don't's of travelling and whilst at Kennel Club licensed events.  
\*When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.  
\*If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.  
\*The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible and plenty of stops should be taken with lots of water available to drink  
\*Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air round the dog.  
\*When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.

Rules & Regulations – continued

\*Keep your dog in the shade – take your own shade, for example a large umbrella and always plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.

\*Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

### DEFINITION OF CLASSES

In the following definition a Challenge Certificate includes any show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members Classes or competing for Members Specials each partner must, at the time of entry, be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. 3<sup>rd</sup> May 2012.

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A First Prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

1. **Withdrawal** The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) and 20.
2. **Transfer**
  - a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight, height and in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
  - b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class, Puppy or Junior class which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or twenty four calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class the Junior Class or the Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
  - c) For any reason other than above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
  - d) If the exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY	For dogs of six but not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the day of the show.
PUPPY	For dogs of six months but not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the day of the show.
JUNIOR	For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the day of the show.
YEARLING	For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the day of the show.
NOVICE	For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes whether restricted or not)
POST GRADUATE	For dogs which have not won 3 Challenge Certificates or 5 or more First Prizes in all at Championship shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit or Open Classes whether restricted or not.
LIMIT	For dogs which have not become Show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship shows in Limit and Open Classes confined to the breed, whether restricted or not at shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN	For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the show.
VETERAN	For dogs of not less than 7 years of age on the day of the show
BREEDERS	For dogs and bitches bred by the exhibitor
BRACE	For two exhibits (either sex or mixed) of one breed, belonging to the same exhibitor, each exhibit having been entered in some class other than Brace or Team.
PROGENY	For a dog or bitch accompanied by at least 3 of its registered progeny, having been entered and exhibited in another class. The Dog or Bitch and the progeny need not be registered in the same ownership.

## Directions to Venue

Leave the M42 at junction 6. Take A45 towards Birmingham. Take next left hand filter and follow signs "All Other Destinations". At island turn left onto the B4438, left into St. Peters Lane. Take next left into Church Lane to Show Venue.
